

Helsinki Airport – To and From

Helsinki-Vantaa Airport offers various transportation options to and from the airport. This info sheet provides an overview of the various options, detailing costs, pros and cons.



Option 1: Train to Helsinki

The airport is served by 2 trains, namely the I and P trains. The train station is located under the airport terminal and is accessible by lift or escalator from the arrival hall. The journey time is approximately 30 minutes, and trains depart about every 10 minutes on Monday to Saturday, and every 15 minutes on Sundays. For detailed information on the timetables, you may access the Journey Planner (http://reittiopas.fi).

Cost: A single ticket for zones ABC (€4,10) would be required, which can be purchased via the HSL app (available on AppStore, GooglePay or AppGallery) or from a ticket machine at the airport station.

Pros: Cost-effective and direct way to get to the central station.

Cons: May not be convenient if travelling with bulky or heavy luggage.





Option 2: Bus to Helsinki

The airport also has a bus stop, with Bus 600 (Rautatinetori vis Aviapolis) that operates to and from the Central Railway Station.

Cost: A single ticket for zones ABC (€4,10) would be required, which can be purchased via the HSL app (available on AppStore, GooglePay or AppGallery) or from a ticket machine at the airport station.

Pros: Operate for longer hours compared to the trains.

Cons: Slower than the train, especially during heavy traffic.

Option 3: Taxi to Helsinki

Pros: Door-to-door service, making it convenient for those with heavy luggage. It is also a cost-effective method for those travelling in groups.

Cons: Typically more expensive than public transportation options. Taxi fare pricing is completely de-regulated in Finland, make sure you discuss the fee before you board.

Option 4: Private Hire to Helsinki

Private Hire services, such as Uber and Bolt, are safe and reliable ride-hailing services available in Finland, and can also be a convenient option for passengers.

Cost: Around €40-50, depending on factors like the time of day and traffic conditions.

Pros: Convenient app-based booking and transparent pricing. Fees can be charged directly to your debit/credit cards upon booking, making it fuss-free.

Cons: Typically more expensive than public transportation options. Private hires do not have a dedicated pick-up spot, however, you can coordinate directly with the driver for a pick-up location outside the arrival hall.
